This was a fabulous trip, enjoyed by all of the children and the adults!








Parc Eglos Football News

A summary of the season so far:

The Stripes and Parc Eglos Reds football teams have been busy in the league. The Stripes remain unbeaten, having drawn with fellow joint leaders, Nansloe, on Monday evening. The highlights were Jory's excellent save and Corey's block. Rowan's goal against St Michael's in a tight 1-0 win could yet prove crucial at the season's end.



On Wednesday Parc Eglos Stripes went to Mounts Bay Academy for this year's ESFA tournament in West Cornwall. The absence of a mini-bus meant we had to reduce the squad to 8 players and we were also without Isaac and Liam, who have scored a few goals already this year. After a steady start (two 0-0 draws) and some excellent defending from Corey, Stanley and Ollie K, as well as astonishing shot stopping from Jory, captain Alfie led the team into the final two games.

A win and a well worked goal from Brody, assisted by Finlay, gave the team victory over Perranworthal. St Ives topped the table going into the last match, until Riley found some space and Brody looped in an excellent goal.
