Although this was our first visit into the local community, the children were so thoughtful and careful when walking to and from the Church. This week, Year 2 had a special visitor to support their learning in Geography. Jo, from the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association, came to talk to us about Cornwall's dairy "farm" to fork" trail. We watched a video that showed how milk is produced from dairy cows and then all the food products that the milk can be turned into. We saw how Rodda's clotted cream is made and Callestick ice-cream too. The children then got stuck into a variety of different farm to fork activities – touch and feel boxes, dressing up, animal puzzles and food chains.

In our Science lessons, the Year 4 children have been exploring how to build and test electrical circuits. We have also created our own switches and used them in our circuits to switch the bulb on and off. This week, we have been testing visiting the Church throughout the week for our different materials in our circuits to see if they are electrical conductors or insulators. We that most metals are good conductors, and that plastic is a good insulator. We also discovered another material that is a good conductor - ask one of the Year 4 children if you want to find out what it was!
